

Answers to most common questions about Maine GRI

Revised April 2005

1. The courses do NOT need to be taken in any particular order;
2. For those starting the GRI program in 2005, you must take courses to complete the designation within a 5-year time period - starting from the time you complete any one module;
3. For those taking Tri-State GRI courses prior to 2005, those courses are grandfathered for use only until December 31, 2006, and then may no longer be used towards Maine GRI credit; (exception are Tri-State courses taken in 2002 - 2004 that may still fall within the five year completion window after 2006;
4. Those who already have the GRI or those who are interested in the courses solely for educational or continuing education credit may also register for the courses;
5. At the completion of **all modules**, proof of completion is sent to MAR to earn the designation. Use the form posted on our website at <http://www.mainerealtors.com>, then click GRI.
6. MAR has records provided to us by Tri-State of courses from the past 25 years. If you need to know what modules their records show as completed, email cindy@mainerealtors.com. We have no way to verify completion of any Tri-State courses not included in those historic records. Please remember, old courses (over 5 years) will not be able to be used for Maine GRI credit after December 31, 2006.
7. There is no advance notification necessary to start the GRI program – you submit the information when all the modules are complete;
8. There is not a challenge exam option for GRI-101 and GRI-102 as had been available from Tri-State several years ago.
