#### GOVERNOR'S ORDER DEEMED REAL ESTATE AS "ESSENTIAL BUSINESS":

As of March 25, the Commissioner of Maine's Department of Economic and Community Development, given authority under Section V of the Executive Order, made the determination that real estate is an "essential business" and can continue with the following restrictions in place:

- In-person open houses are prohibited
- During all interactions, CDC and the Executive Order guidelines for personal and work site safety should be followed, including: physical distancing, group size, and health and safety precautions. (see links below)
- Gatherings of more than 10 persons are prohibited

The Governor and DECD Commissioner are urging remote work to the maximum extent practicable

#### MUNICIPAL EXECUTIVE ORDERS REMINDER:

Please note that any local municipal orders that are more restrictive are permitted by the Governor's Executive Order. This means that if your local municipality passes an Order that has additional restrictions on business practices, then those restrictions are also enforceable and must be followed. If you are unsure, call your local town office for guidance and interpretation of their Order as it relates to your business.

#### PLEASE UNDERSTAND:

The Governor (and municipalities) can pull the "essential business" designation at any time. REALTORS® should act within the spirit of the Orders, or we will be in jeopardy of not

# FINANCIAL RELIEF: CARE ACT:

The federal government's financial relief bill, the CARE Act, has been signed by the President. The National Association of REALTORS® worked tirelessly to have Independent Contractors, self-employed, and small businesses included in these financial relief programs. ### MAINE INCOME TAX DEADLINES EXTENDED TO JULY 15:

Deadlines to file Maine income tax payments, including any final and estimated payments, have been extended from April 15 to July 15. The Maine filing deadline for individual, corporate, and estate and trust income tax returns is automatically tied to any federal filing extension and is therefore also extended to July 15. Filing and payment deadlines for sales and use tax and for payroll tax are not affected. For more information: Click Here
