FINANCIAL RELIEF: CARES ACT:

The federal government's financial relief bill, the CARES Act, was signed the President on Friday. The REALTOR® Association worked tirelessly to have Independent Contractors, self-employed, and small businesses included in these financial relief programs. PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE:

On March 27, Congress enacted, and the President signed, new unemployment programs to provide relief to people affected by COVID-19. These new programs are complex, the eligibility guidelines are not yet established, and the Maine Department of Labor is working to implement the programs as quickly as possible. Those who are self-employed in Maine should wait to file a claim for benefits. Since these programs have not been implemented yet, filing at this point will only result in a denial. We will continue to provide information as it becomes available. Once implemented, benefits will be paid retroactively to eligible Mainers.

CARES ACT: SBA RESOURCES:

The CARES Act includes over \$350 billion dollars in small business relief (500 employees or less including independent contractors) through two Small Business Administration loan vehicles expected to be available within two weeks:

- SBA 7(b)(2) loans Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EDIL) - Grants available within 3 business days for immediate relief up to \$10K
- SBA 7(a) loans Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) - Forgivable loans available at 250% of an employer's average monthly payroll up to \$10M

MREC UPDATE:

As of March 30, the Maine Real Estate Commission has made no changes to licensing, renewals, or continuing education requirements, however access to the MREC offices is now restricted to employees only. MREC staff are working on-site and telephone calls and emails are being addressed. They are still receiving and processing postal service mail. To transact business, make inquiries, or file complaints with the MREC, please use online, email (rlestate.com@maine.gov) or telephone services (207-624-8521).

FEMA EXTENDS NFIP GRACE PERIOD:

To avoid a lapse in coverage, there is typically a 30-day grace period to renew National Flood Insurance Program policies. However, due to the widespread economic disruption arising from this pandemic, FEMA is extending the grace period to renew flood insurance policies from 30 to 120 days. If a policy has an expiration date between February 13, 2020 and June 15, 2020, then the NFIP insurer must receive the appropriate renewal premium within 120 days of the expiration date to avoid a lapse in coverage.

GOVERNOR'S ORDER DEEMED REAL ESTATE AS "ESSENTIAL BUSINESS":

As of March 25, the Commissioner of Maine's Department of Economic and Community Development, given authority under Section V of the Executive Order, made the determination that real estate is an "essential business" and can continue with the following restrictions in place:

- In-person open houses are prohibited
- During all interactions, CDC and the Executive Order guidelines for personal and work site safety should be followed, including: physical distancing, group size, and health and safety precautions.
- Gatherings of more than 10 persons are prohibited
- The Governor and DECD Commissioner are urging remote work to the maximum extent practicable

MUNICIPAL EXECUTIVE ORDERS REMINDER:

Please note that any local municipal orders that are more restrictive are permitted by the Governor's Executive Order. This means that if your local municipality passes an Order that has additional restrictions on business practices, then those restrictions are also enforceable and must be followed. If you are unsure, call your local town office for guidance and interpretation of their Order as it relates to your business.

PLEASE UNDERSTAND:

The Governor (and municipalities) can pull the "essential business" designation at any time. REALTORS® should act within the spirit of the Orders, or we will be in jeopardy of not being able to service our Maine clients and customers. Please be professional, respect all parties involved in the transaction and their directives, leverage available technology, and strive

to conduct your work remotely to the maximum extent practicable. We're in this together!
