REAL ESTATE SIGNS REMINDERS:

Maine State law (Title 23) prohibits placement of any signs whatsoever anywhere except on the property being sold, and even those signs must be placed in such a way as to not interfere with the road right of way or with the visibility of turning traffic.

Please remove real estate

signs, including directional arrow signs, from intersections that are not on the property being sold.

Please remember to remove your signs after your listing expires, is terminated, or when the property closes. Part of the Maine Real Estate Commission advertising rule states, "A real estate brokerage agency or its affiliated licensees shall not advertise any real estate for sale without first obtaining the written permission of the owner or the owner's authorized representative." MREC Rule Chapter 410(1)(5). Your listing agreement has a Yes/No checkbox about whether your seller client wants to allow a "For Sale" sign on the property. If the seller selects "Yes" to allowing a "For Sale" sign, this written permission is only for the duration of the listing agreement and ends upon the agreement's expiration, termination, or when the property closes.

Maine Listings Rules and Regulations state that only the for-sale

sign of the listing participant may be placed on the property (4.2). Only participants who participated in the transaction as the listing participant or cooperating/selling participant may claim to have sold the property. Prior to closing, a cooperating participant may only post a sold sign with the consent of the listing participant. (4.3)

IMPLIED PERMISSION:

Have you reviewed Maine's laws around accessing private land for recreation (hiking, hunting, etc.) and shared resources with your clients? Unlike most of the U.S. Maine has an implied permission structure for accessing land; if the land is not posted, it is legal to use. The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife has an Outdoors Partners Program designed to assist landowners and the public.
